Introduction

At a time when international cooperation is critical for tackling transport-related societal challenges, such as climate change, air pollution, congestion, and road safety, the exchange and cooperation opportunities offered by POLIS are instrumental. **POLIS membership** thus grants unique access to resources, networking opportunities with both public and private stakeholders, and European project support.

Our membership draws from across Europe and beyond, from large capitals, including London and Paris, to small and medium-sized cities, such as Leuven and Ravenna, as well as regions, such as Baden Württemberg and Catalonia.

The **fifth edition** of the [POLIS Leadership Summit in Zagreb](#) convened leading voices in transport to address key themes at the heart of today's mobility agenda, including strengthening the fundamentals of sustainable transport, improving governance for emerging technologies, and removing barriers to more effective cooperation between public and private actors. The event sparked vital discussions on the political challenges and decisions that are defining the path toward more sustainable, inclusive, and resilient mobility systems.
