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

Walking in London



- Peak hour congestion is a problem on the roads and Underground
- Potential to convert short, motorised trips in inner/outer London, and short tube trips in central London

Mayor of London's Walking Policies




"We at TfL are going to do everything in our power to make walking through this city as attractive and enjoyable as possible."

Aims of the Walking Team

- More short journeys
- More longer trips using walking & public transport
- Revitalisation of public spaces to increase enjoyment of walking



What does the TfL Walking team do?

- Delivers infrastructure improvements
- Undertakes walking audits
- Researches pedestrian barriers and issues
- Removes barriers for disabled people
- Promotes walking
- Organises training
- Works with property developers







Key Walking Routes: an integrated approach





Walking Audits

- TfL uses Pedestrian Environment Review System (PERS)
- 80 audits complete = 194km = 35% of TfL roads
- Analysis of
 - Routes
 - Links
 - Crossings
 - Public Transport Interchanges
 - Public Spaces




Why Do We Need Legible London?

- Encourage Modal shift
- Increase
 Confidence
- Provide Consistency





What must Legible London have?

What Do People Think of Legible London?

- 16% reduction in journey time
- 85% found system easy to use
- 62% said system would encourage them to walk more
- 91% supported roll out



Benchmarking: Making Walking Count


- Working with Walk21 to develop a benchmarking tool for walking






Pedestrian Counts
