Speakers

Heather Allen is a Programme Director and works on sustainable transport issues at TRL. Her experience is focussed on urban transport and is very international as she worked for UITP (the international association of public transport) for 17 years.

Dominique Salas is leading the study unit on the Toulouse bus network at Tisséo-SMTC, the public transport authority of Toulouse. At present she is leading a study about the Tisséo bus network in 2030. Dominique has spent 20 years in public transport, half with service providers and half with institutions in charge of financing and defining the short- and long-term transport strategies.

Hanna Hüging is a research fellow at the Wuppertal Institute for Climate, Environment and Energy. Her research focuses is on energy-efficient and low-carbon transport strategies and on analysis and evaluation of transport policies and measures. She is currently involved a project funded by the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research that analyses the current situation of electric mobility worldwide. Ms. Hüging holds a MSc in Environmental Science from the University of Cologne and a BA in Geography from the University of Osnabrück.

Li Zhenyu is an Assistant Professor in CUSTReC, China Academy of Transportation Sciences (CATS), Ministry Of Transport (MOT), P.R.China. His research interests cover transport strategy and policies on energy saving and emission reduction, green transport, low carbon transport and climate change. Mr. Li has published 10 papers and 1 book in recent years.
