What is the ECOSTARS Scheme?

- The original scheme in South Yorkshire
- Main aim of ECOSTARS = cleaner air
- Motivation to participate:
 - Benefits for administrations
 - Benefits for transport operators
 - Benefits for citizens





ECOSTARS as a tool of co-operation

- Co-operation among city/region administration, operator and auditor
- Recruitment, assessment, certificates
- Vehicle stickers, logo for company use, promotion of results by the project and the administration
- Road Map = tailored recommendations
- Company progress monitoring in time
- Additional services (seminars etc.)





ECOSTARS assessment criteria

- Based on engine EURO standards plus alternative fuels use and operational enhancement
- Focussed on ‘standardised’ assessment of:
 - A specific vehicle
 - A whole fleet
 - A company operation





ECOSTARS Europe Project (1)
