Module 1

Walking & Accessibility Schemes – Principles & Practice (1 day)

Date: 5th June, 9am – 5pm

A full day concerned with analysing common pedestrian issues and how they might be addressed to provide enhanced walking environments across London.

Module 2

Accessible Streets (½ day)

Date: 9th June, 9am – 1:30pm

A half day that addresses accessibility issues within the pedestrian environment and how they can be better provided for across London.

Module 3

Designing for Pedestrians using PERS (½ day)

Date: 11th June, 9am – 1:30pm

A half day that focuses on walking audits and how they can be used to benefit and support walking improvements with a specific focus on PERS.

These modules can be taken as a complete course or as individual units to suit needs and interests. Each module is delivered by industry professionals with the opportunity to meet the TfL Walking & Accessibility team during Module 1.
