Regulatory Supportive Tools

- Knowledge bank: it provides information about the new mobility services and technologies that are currently available or will be available in the market.
- Regulatory Frameworks Dashboard: an assessment tool of the economic, technological and social impacts of disruptive technologies and business models on regulatory and governance frameworks;
- Compliance Map: a visualisation of the results of the Dashboard applied to case studies;
- Adaptive Roadmap: target for better regulatory policy and actions needed for achievement.
