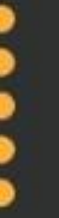

# Public Spaces



“Public spaces,” in the simplest terms, are the spaces between buildings and facilities that are open to the public, consisting broadly of three types of urban spaces: **streets and pedestrian access; open and green spaces**, including parks, plazas, waterbodies, and waterfronts; and public facilities like libraries, community centers, and municipal markets (UN-Habitat 2015).
