POLIS Political Programme

Women in transport

With only 22% of women working in transport in the European Union, the transport sector is far from gender-balanced. POLIS wants to play a role in making women in transport more visible and offering them a platform to share their work. Over the past years, we have consistently encouraged women in the transport sector to respond to our calls for speakers in greater numbers and we are happy to see that we are making progress with every conference. At the same time, we are also faced with the current non-gender balanced reality, which naturally leads to non-gender balanced sessions at our conference. The conference sessions have been shaped on the basis of the – numerous – applications we received through our open call for speakers, where the quality and innovation level of the applications was our main selection criterion. This year's parallel sessions represent 53% male and 47% female speakers, again a major improvement.
