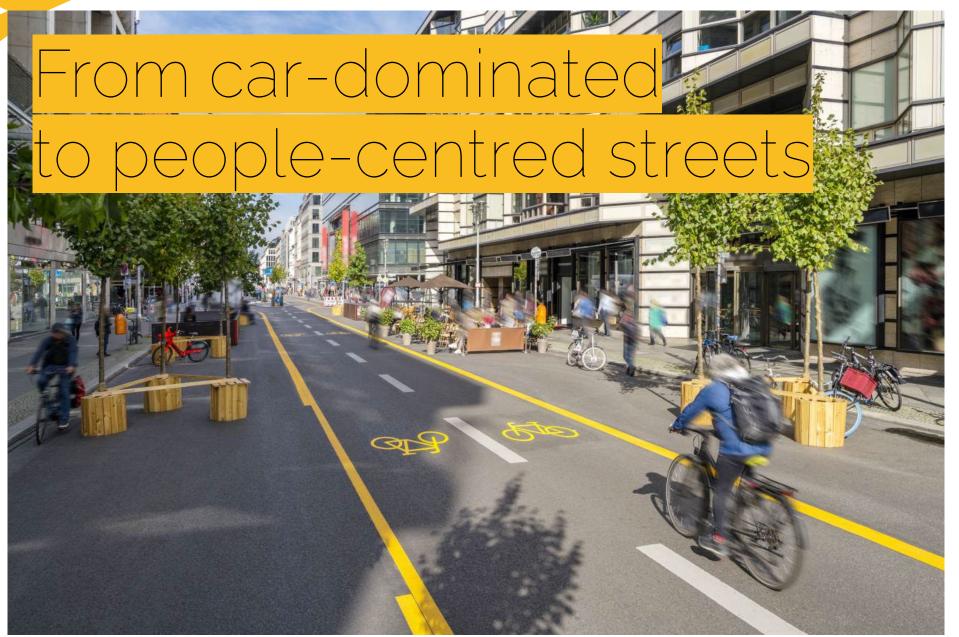

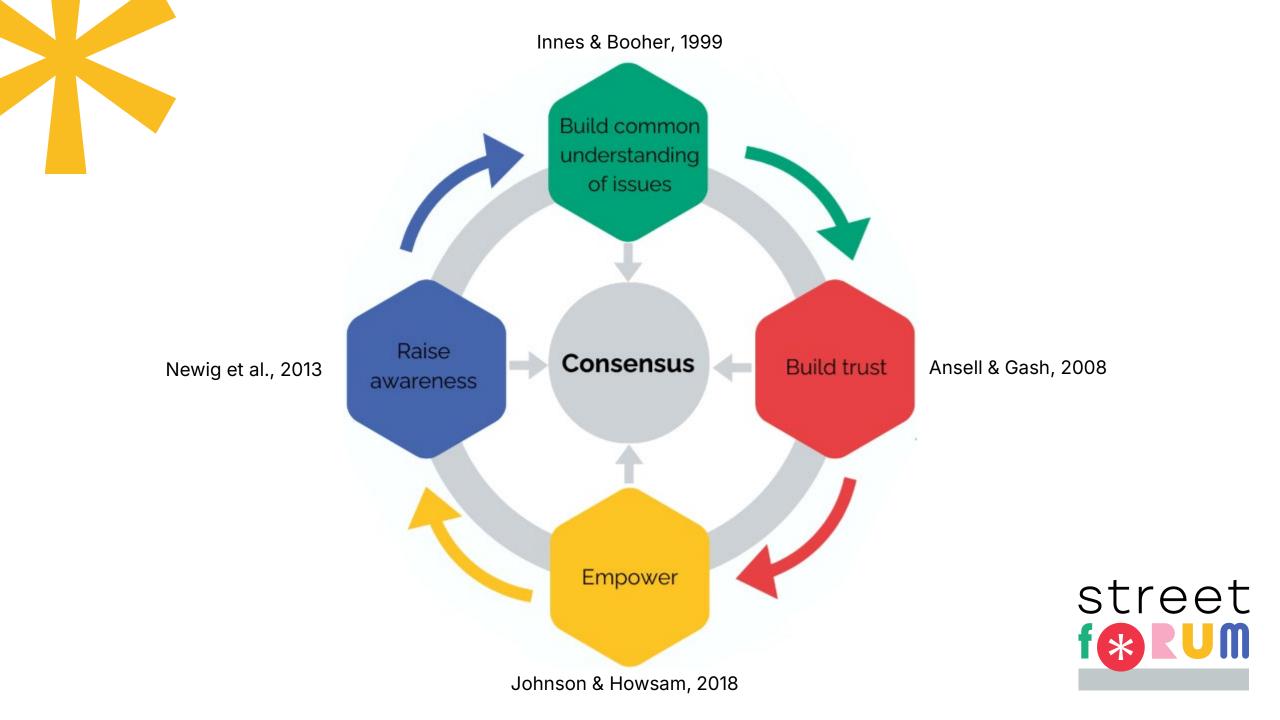

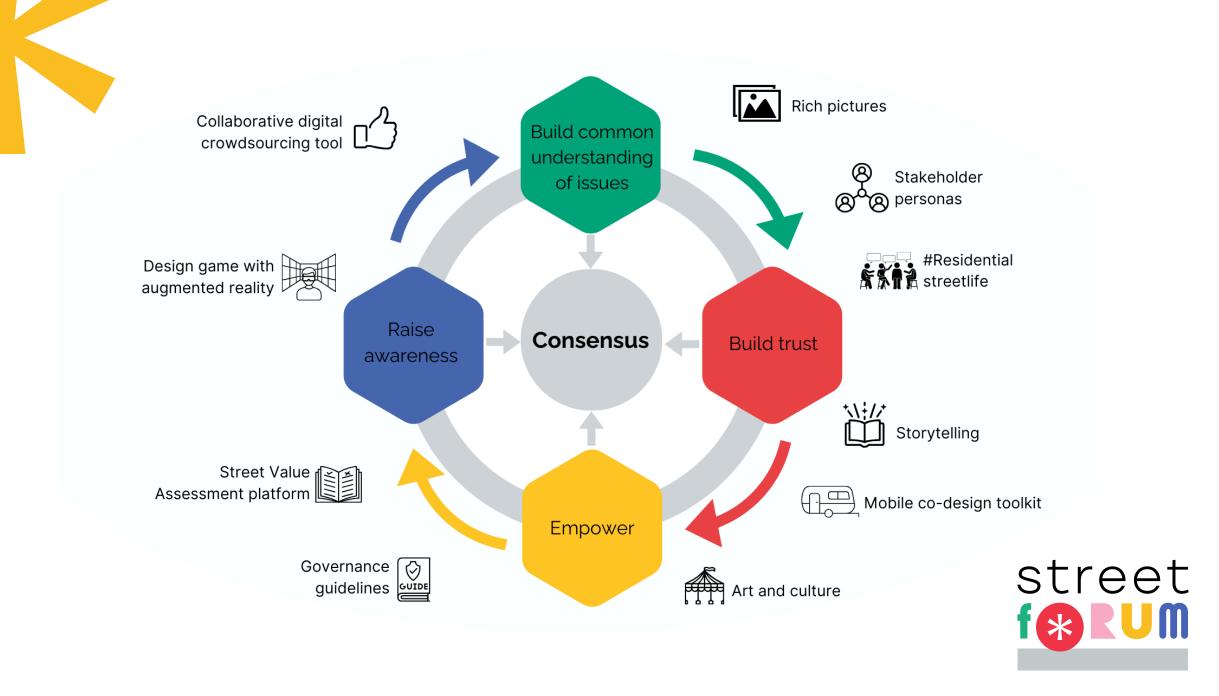

First learnings Living Labs

- A stakeholder analysis creates awareness of power relations
- Processes don't start from a blank page, approach should be tailored to its context
- Combining multiple tools increases impact
- Hybrid use of digital tools to overcome language barriers & low levels of digitalization
- Local partners are key to stakeholder engagement
- Activities in public space offer a low-threshold access to participation.
- When consensus is not possible, aim for compromise
