Leadership Summit

Our Leadership Summit brings together high-level political and technical leaders in government, business, advocacy, research, and action. It convenes annually to facilitate a high-level dialogue between the public and private sectors, enable knowledge exchange, foster peer-to-peer cooperation, and feed the development of messages to the COP and other events.

The fourth edition of the [POLIS Leadership Summit in Rome](#) convened leading voices in transport to delve into four critical themes shaping the future of urban mobility: leadership dilemmas, transport poverty, digital infrastructure, and green competitiveness. Building on the momentum of the summit's [third edition in Prague](#), the event sparked vital discussions on the political challenges and decisions that are defining the path toward more sustainable, inclusive, and resilient mobility systems.
